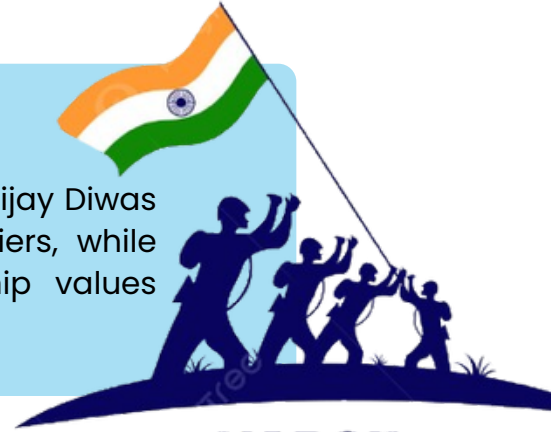

Kargil Vijay Diwas – Courage, Sacrifice & Patriotism

Objective:

To help students understand the significance of Kargil Vijay Diwas and honour the bravery and sacrifice of Indian soldiers, while developing reading, inquiry, reflection, and citizenship values through guided use of the Britannica Library.

Students will:

- Understand why Kargil Vijay Diwas is observed
- Learn about the Kargil War and the bravery of Indian armed forces
- Develop reading comprehension and research skills
- Reflect on courage, sacrifice, and national responsibility
- Build respect and gratitude for soldiers and national service

Introduce the Weekly Theme / Genre:

Begin with a class discussion:

- What does the word *bravery* mean?
- Who protects our country?
- Why should we remember important events in our nation's history?

Explain that **Kargil Vijay Diwas is celebrated on 26 July** to commemorate India's victory in the Kargil War (1999) and to honour the soldiers who sacrificed their lives for the nation.

Suggested Activities by Grade Band

Grades I & II

- Students begin by exploring pictures and short readings from the Britannica Library about India's pride, heritage, and symbols. Encourage them to observe carefully and discuss what they learn.
- Students explore topics such as:
 - Indian soldiers (their role and contribution)
 - National symbols (flag, animal, tree, bird, etc.)
- You may guide them using prompts like:
 - Who are Indian soldiers and what do they do?
 - What are some national symbols of India?
 - Why are these symbols important for the country?
- Students will express their understanding through drawing, pasting, and writing short responses.
- They will:
 - Draw or paste a picture of a soldier or the Indian flag
 - Draw or paste one national symbol of their choice (e.g., tree, animal, fruit)
 - Share their favourite location in India and explain why they like it
- Encourage them to use simple sentences, labels, and colourful drawings.
