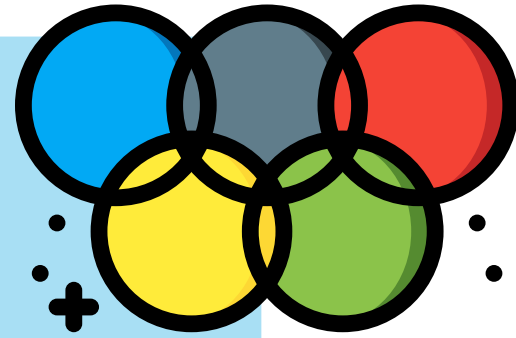

International Olympic Day – Excellence, Friendship & Fair Play

Objective:

To help students understand the Olympic values of excellence, respect, and friendship, while exploring the history and spirit of the Olympic Games through guided reading and inquiry using Britannica Library.



Students will:

- Understand the significance of International Olympic Day
- Learn about the Olympic Games and famous athletes
- Recognise values such as teamwork, perseverance, and fair play
- Develop reading, reflection, and discussion skills using authentic sources

Introduce the Weekly Theme / Genre:

Begin with a discussion:

- What is a sport?
- Why do people from different countries play together in the Olympics?

Explain that International Olympic Day (23 June) celebrates the founding of the modern Olympic Games and promotes participation in sports.

Suggested Activities by Grade Band

Grades IX – X

- Students begin by reading age-appropriate articles using the Britannica Library on the following topics:
 - History of the Olympic movement
 - Sports and global unity
- Encourage students to read actively and focus on:
 - How the Olympic Games began and evolved over time
 - The role of sports in bringing countries together
 - Important values such as unity, peace, and international cooperation
- Using the Britannica Library, students will work with a partner to research:
 - A historical event related to the Olympic Games (e.g., revival of the modern Olympics, significant Olympic moments)*
- OR
- A famous Olympic personality
- Encourage students to explore:
 - Key facts and background information
 - Important achievements or contributions
 - Challenges faced and their impact on the world
 - How their topic connects to the idea of global unity
- Encourage students to keep their points clear, relevant, and concise.
- Ask students to discuss with their partner:
 - What did you learn about the Olympic movement?
 - How does sports help unite people across the world?
 - Why are the Olympics important even today?
