## Objective:

To help students understand the dignity of labour, recognise the contribution of different professions, and develop respect and empathy towards all forms of work through guided exploration using Britannica Library.

- Why is every type of work important in society?

Explain that International Labour Day (1 May) celebrates the hard work and contributions of workers across all fields, and reminds us to respect the dignity of labour and value every profession.

# Suggested Activities by Grade Band

## Grades VI – VIII

- Choose a Sector
- Select a sector such as:
  - Agriculture
  - Healthcare
  - Education
  - Transportation
  - Construction
- Use Britannica Library to research one type of worker within that sector.
- Explore the Following:
  - Introduction
    - Who are these workers?
    - What do they do?
  - Role in Society
    - How do they contribute to daily life?
    - Who depends on their work?
  - Interdependence
    - How is this job connected to other professions?
    - Example: Farmers → Transport → Shops → Consumers
  - Understanding Imbalance
    - What happens if there are too few workers in this sector?
    - What impact would it have on society and economy?
  - Create the Cause & Effect Chart
    - Show how the worker's role affects society
    - Include consequences of shortage or disruption
