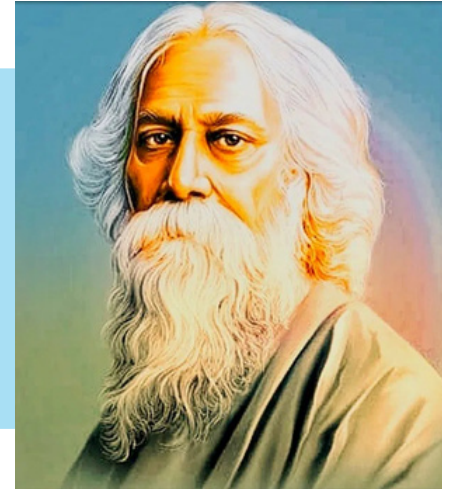
May Week 2



Rabindranath Tagore Jayanti

Objective:

To help students explore the life, contributions, and literary legacy of Rabindranath Tagore while developing appreciation for literature, creativity, and cultural heritage through guided exploration using Britannica Library.



Students will:

- Understand who Rabindranath Tagore was and why he is an important literary figure
- Recognise the role of literature, poetry, and art in expressing ideas and emotions
- Develop curiosity about Indian culture and heritage
- Strengthen reading, discussion, and creative thinking skills using Britannica Library

Introduce the Weekly Theme / Genre:

Begin with a discussion:

- What is a poem?
- Why do people write stories and poems?
- Have you heard of Rabindranath Tagore?

Suggested Activities by Grade Band

Grades III – V

- Students begin by reading age-appropriate Britannica Library articles on Rabindranath Tagore, focusing on key aspects of his life and achievements.
- Facilitate a brief discussion by asking:
 - When was Rabindranath Tagore born?
 - What kind of work did he create?
 - Why is he remembered and celebrated today?
- Students will express their understanding by creating a Tagore Fact Card, including:
 - One important fact about his life
 - One famous work by him
 - One interesting thing they learned
- Encourage students to present their cards and share simple statements such as:
 - “Rabindranath Tagore was born in 1861.”
 - “He wrote poems and songs.”
 - “He was the first Indian to win a Nobel Prize.”

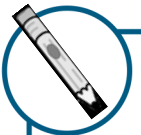
