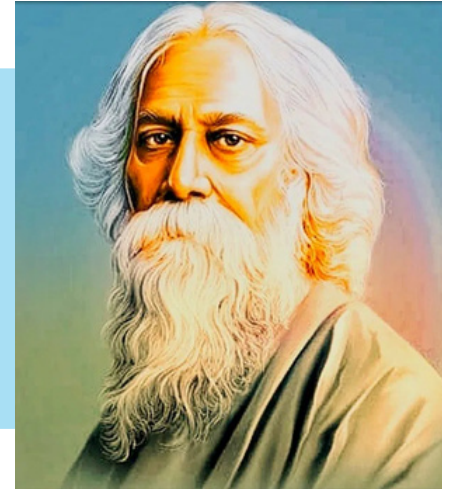


Rabindranath Tagore Jayanti

Objective:

To help students explore the life, contributions, and literary legacy of Rabindranath Tagore while developing appreciation for literature, creativity, and cultural heritage through guided exploration using Britannica Library.



Students will:

- Understand who Rabindranath Tagore was and why he is an important literary figure
- Recognise the role of literature, poetry, and art in expressing ideas and emotions
- Develop curiosity about Indian culture and heritage
- Strengthen reading, discussion, and creative thinking skills using Britannica Library

Introduce the Weekly Theme / Genre:

Begin with a discussion:

- What is a poem?
- Why do people write stories and poems?
- Have you heard of Rabindranath Tagore?

Suggested Activities by Grade Band

Grades VI – VIII

- Students begin by researching Rabindranath Tagore’s contributions to poetry, music, and education using the Britannica Library, exploring how his work influenced literature and learning.
- Facilitate a brief discussion by asking:
 - Why is literature important for society?
 - How do poems express emotions and ideas?
 - What makes Tagore’s writing unique and meaningful?
- Students will reflect on their understanding through a See–Think–Wonder activity:
 - What do you see in the poem or story?
 - What do you think it means?
 - What do you wonder about the author’s ideas?
- Encourage students to share their reflections with simple responses such as:
 - “I see emotions and nature in the poem.”
 - “I think the poem is about freedom and feelings.”
 - “I wonder what inspired Tagore to write this.”
