World Earth Day – Caring for Our Planet



Objective:

To help students understand the importance of protecting the Earth by exploring environmental issues and sustainable practices, while developing reading, inquiry, and action-oriented thinking skills through guided use of Britannica Library.

Students will:

- Understand why World Earth Day is observed
- Learn about environmental challenges and conservation
- Develop reading comprehension, note-making, and reflection skills
- Build a sense of responsibility towards the planet

Introduce the Weekly Theme / Genre:

Begin with a class discussion:

- What is Earth?
- Why do we need to take care of our planet?

Explain that World Earth Day (22 April) is observed to raise awareness about protecting the environment and living sustainably.

Suggested Activities by Grade Band

Grades I & II

- Students begin by exploring colorful pictures and short, simple readings on the Earth using the Britannica Library. Guide them to observe and talk about different elements of nature and their surroundings.
- Encourage students to explore topics such as:
 - Plants and trees (how they grow, why they are important)
 - Animals and birds (where they live, what they need)
 - Clean and healthy surroundings (parks, rivers, streets)
- Ask students to carefully observe and discuss:
 - What do you see in the pictures?
 - What do you like the most about Earth?
 - What makes a place clean or dirty?
- Students will then express their understanding through drawing.
- Encourage them to draw:
 - One thing they love about Earth (e.g., trees, animals, rivers, flowers)
 - One way they can help keep Earth clean (e.g., throwing waste in a dustbin, saving water, not plucking plants)
- Encourage them to add simple labels or short sentences such as:
 - "I love trees."
 - "I will not litter."
