

All plants belong to one of two main groups, vascular plants and nonvascular plants. Vascular plants have special tissues, called xylem and phloem, that carry water and food throughout the plant. Vascular plants also have **roots**, stems, and **leaves**. Vascular plants include herbaceous plants, shrubs, and trees. Herbaceous plants have soft stems. Shrubs and trees have woody stems.



Why Are Some Features Grayed Out in Translated Articles?

When you use the Google Translate tool on Britannica Library, some features – like Cite, Save, Send, and Read-Aloud – are disabled. This is because the translated version is generated by Google, not Britannica.

Citing & Saving
These tools work with Britannica's original content, but since Google generates the translation, citations and saved versions would not reflect the translated text.

Read-Aloud
This feature reads Britannica's original content and does not support the translated text.

Sending Articles
When sharing an article, only the original English version is available to avoid confusion.

Printing
While Britannica does not generate a formatted print page for translations, you may be able to print using your browser's print function.


Make Your Own CREATURE






