

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1. Now we are ready to make a video! Go to **LumieLabs** and start a new video template by selecting **shot-by-shot**. Create a name for your video story.




2. Select the title card icon to add a title slide to begin your video.




- 3. Use the icon to add your selected tile card to your story.
- 4. Select the **edit clip** button to open the clip edit window.




5. In the **clip edit window**, you can add the title to your story and your name. You can also adjust the font and size of the text! Make sure you click **save** when you are done.




6. Now it is time to add **video clips** to your story! Use your completed **video storyboard** to help you search for clips in *LumieLabs* that are similar to the pictures/words that you drew in your storyboard boxes. Click on the **magnifying glass** to perform a keyword search based on each section of your video storyboard.



7. For each section of your video storyboard, perform a **keyword search** and choose **1-2 video clips** from your keyword search that you want to add to your story. Select the contonion icon to add a video clip to your story. You should have about **6-12 video clips** added to your story when you are done.



- 8. Once your video clips are selected, you are ready to record your script from your **video storyboard**. Practice reading your script aloud several times! To record your voice, select the ① icon on the first clip of your story.
- 9. To **add a voice-over**, a box will open for you to record your script. Click the **record** button when you are ready to record!



10. Once you have added your voice-over, click the **edit clip** button to open the clip edit window.



11. This window allows you to make all sorts of changes to your video clips! Here you can **adjust the length** of each video clip. Try making a clip longer so it will match with your voice-over!



12. Now we should add some background music to your video! Select the **music note** to view the music options. **Add music** to your video and adjust the sound so your voice-over can be heard above the music.



13. In the music section, click the **arrow** to select the different **music moods** that are available. Select a mood that matches the tone of your video! *LumieLabs* will provide a selection of music options to choose from. Select the icon to add your choice of music.



14. Once you have added a piece of music, the **music toolbar** will be open at the bottom. Use the toolbar to adjust your background music volume. You want to be able to hear your voice clearly on your video!



- 15. Now that you have all the pieces for your story, review the <u>Video Editing Best Practices</u> with to guide you in editing your video and in making any last minute changes.
- 16. At the bottom right-hand corner of your screen, click **preview** to make sure your video includes all the necessary information.



17. Once your video is completed, click **finish** to "render" and "finish" your video.




18. Your finished videos can be found in My Videos.



19. To **share** your completed video, select the arrow button.



20. The "**share video**" window will open up. From here you will see the option to "**post to a video wall**" and choose the wall your teacher has instructed you to post your video to. Press the **share** button at the bottom of the window to share you video to that classroom wall.







### Video Editing Best Practice with LumieLabs







Be consistent with style and positioning.



Add desired overlays and filters, where appropriate, to enhance your story.



Give your audience enough time to read and digest each clip. Select proper transitions to control the flow of your story.

Adjust the audio levels so that the narration is clear.



You're almost done! Now preview your video as an objective consumer. Have you successfully conveyed what you want audiences to feel after viewing it?

Where do viewers go from here? What do you want them to do after viewing your video?



Invite feedback from a focus group made up of people with diverse perspectives, and decide what changes, if any, need to be made.
