Article Page Tools

Share

Share articles and images across a number of different platforms by selecting the “Share” icon at the top of the page. Choose between sharing via Email, Google Classroom, Google Drive, or Microsoft Teams!

Favorite

Click on the “Favorite” icon to add an article to your Favorites or a specific Resource Pack that you’ve created. This is a great way of planning for a research project and gathering content in advance.

Print

Select the “Print” icon to print the article from your device!

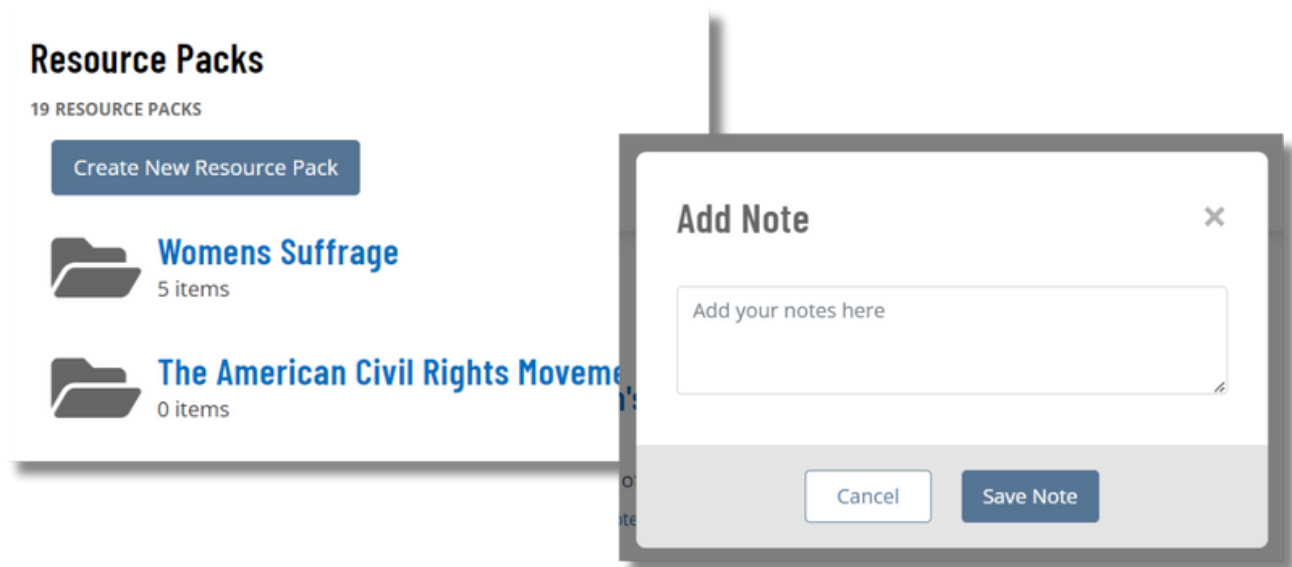
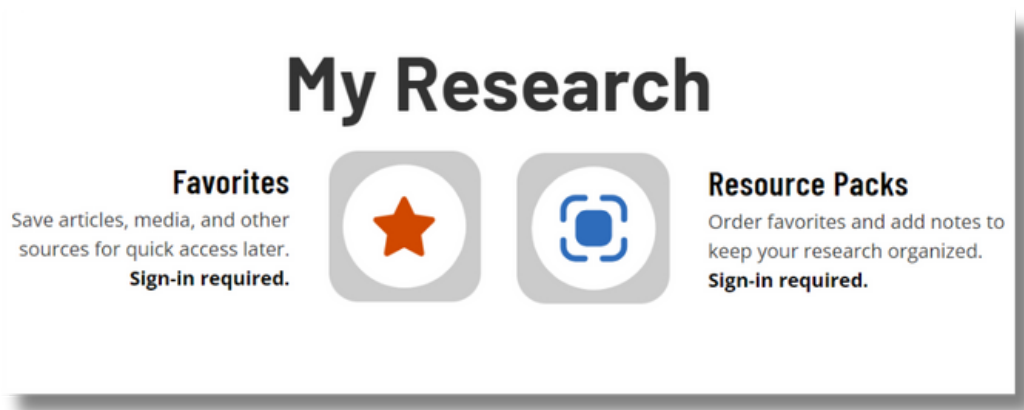
Teach users about the importance of citations! Easily generate citations in a variety of formats through the check box on the toolbar. Britannica keeps this sometimes difficult process as simple as possible for all levels and abilities.

Literacy Support Tools

There are many ways to support readers and encourage independent reading. Use the Read Aloud tool to have the text read aloud while following along with the highlighted text. Support vocabulary acquisition by using the Quick Click Dictionary. Simply double click on the unknown word to access the Merriam-Webster Dictionary definition, along with a Spanish translation. You can also translate content into more than 100 languages.

My Research

Users can set up a personal My Research account to view their favorited content and organize it into Resources Packs. The notes section allows users to easily record notes on each piece of content!



Account Set Up

Select "My Research" in the upper right-hand corner of any page of Britannica Academic. When the login box appears, select "Create an account." Fill in the required information and select the "Create Account" button. Now you are ready to collect Britannica information and create Resources Packs to share with others.

How should users use Resources Packs?

Users can keep track of the content they have found as they research by organizing it into a Resource Pack. They can use the notes section to write summaries of key points and other notes they collect as they research. Users can email and share the pack with teachers and peers to share their progress.
