



#### **Search and Filter**


You can filter lessons by grade level or lesson topic. Search for a particular lesson using keywords or phrases or search by standards to see lessons that match your state, grade, and subject.

Each lesson is built around a four-stage learning journey that works together to deliver a student-centered learning experience. Follow the stages as a student learns about Ancient Egypt.






Students are introduced to important vocabulary used throughout the lesson.

#### **Build Knowledge**


After sparking curiosity and interest, students build their knowledge about the lesson topic through images, graphs, maps, and text.

#### **Read Aloud**


Students can hear the text read aloud.


#### **Reading Levels**




#### Connect




#### **Extend Student Learning**


Lesson teaching materials and activity guides provide ideas and instructions for hands-on modeling, investigation, and inquiry activities.



## **Adding a Class**



#### **Option 1**

#### **Add a New Class**

Choose **Create Britannica Class** if you are not importing a class with Google. Create a class for each group of students you teach or group of learners with similar learning needs and styles.


#### **Option 2**

#### **Import from Google**

Import existing classes from your Google Classroom account. Instruct students to Sign in with Google, no invite needed.

#### **Create the Class**

Enter the name of your class, the day or time, and select an avatar for your class.



For your students to complete lessons, they must first create a personal account and join your class using the class code.




#### **Invite Students**

Invite students to join the class using a class code or direct link.

the four Lexile reading levels offered for


each grade band.

### Set the Reading Level per Student

Using the reading recommendation as a starting point, adjust each student's reading level according to their specific needs.

#### Set your students' reading levels


- Easily and consistently differentiate lesson text passages by predefining each student's reading level.
- Customize to meet individual needs by locking the selected reading levels for some or all of the class.
- Make changes to student settings any time it's necessary.
- Select the grade of your class to get a customized reading recommendation.



#### Choose Whether to Level Lock

Decide individually if students should be able to move up or down from the reading level selected.

### **View Assigned Lessons**

#### View All Assignments


View assignments that are current, future, or past due.

### **See Student Scores**

Review student responses and scores on a specific lesson.

#### **View Lesson**

Review the content of the lesson and see the student view of the assignment.



#### **Edit Details**

Adjust the due date of an open lesson. If it's scheduled for the future, you can change either date.

#### **Delete an Assignment**

Remove any assigned lessons from a class and from the students' dashboards.




Monitor student progress in real-time to track learning and growth.

View how individual students answered each question in a lesson and get a snapshot of your class's understanding of the content.






